

SOCIETY OF ST. VINCENT DE PAUL NEWS HELPING ELDERLY NEIGHBORS FACING EVICTION

"When we serve the poor and sick we serve Jesus."

– St. Rose of Lima

Older adults increasingly face housing affordability challenges. Due to rising housing costs, over 10 million households headed by someone 65 and over are struggling to pay for their housing. To compensate, elderly households often cut back on food and medical care, which can be detrimental for those with chronic health conditions.

One recent example of this situation was two elderly siblings living in an apartment in our neighborhood. The brother had recently undergone surgeries for throat and stomach cancer and the sister was bedridden and on oxygen. The siblings were confronted with increased medical expenses making it difficult to pay their rent in a timely manner. The landlord filed for eviction and a hearing was scheduled in Franklin County Municipal Court.

When there was nowhere else to turn, the elderly siblings met with Society of St. Vincent de Paul (SVDP) representatives through the home visit program. SVDP provided rent assistance to stop eviction proceedings and supplied the family with food and other resources for additional assistance. Our subsequent home visits revealed that the siblings are now receiving Social Security checks which will help them to make the rent payments going forward. We also set them up with a caseworker to assist them in moving forward.


Last year, our St. Timothy Conference partnered with other SVDP organizations and assisted 130 families with their past due rent and utilities through our home visit program. Most of these families were facing eviction after struggling to make their monthly rent and utility bills. Thank you for your commitment to making our community a better place through your support of SVDP.
