

Helping a Single Mother Facing Eviction

"Blessed is the one who considers the poor. In the day of trouble, the Lord delivers him." Psalm 41:1

Many times, families in our community come to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul (SVDP) when there is nowhere else to turn. Every one of your gifts to us makes an immediate and life-changing difference for each family that we feed or assist to prevent rent evictions and utility shutoffs.

This past year, our St. Timothy Conference has partnered with other SVDP organizations and has assisted 130 families with their past-due rent and utilities through our home visit program. Most of these families were facing eviction after struggling to make their monthly rent and utility bills. One recent example was a single mother with a four-year-old daughter. The mother lost her job after she missed work due to number of medical issues associated with a liver disorder. This caused the family to fall behind on their rent and an eviction was filed. Stopping this eviction before it happened was critical. Evictions are a destabilizing event that can send a family into a cycle of financial and emotional turmoil. SVDP provided the rent assistance to stop eviction proceedings and supplied the family with food and other resources for additional assistance. The mother has since been approved for disability payments and should be fine going forward.

COATS FOR CHRISTMAS

We are very thankful for our parish members who participated in our Annual Coats for Christmas Giving. We were able to provide coats, gloves, hats, scarves, blankets and other winter items to the clients visiting the SVDP Clothing Distribution Center. Your support allows us to continue to provide resources to the people who need it most.
