SOCIETY OF ST. VINCENT DE PAUL NEWS Helping Prevent Utility Shutoffs

Your donations allow members of St. Vincent de Paul (SVDP) to help our neighbors who are experiencing hardships with their unpaid utilities. Studies have suggested that utility shutoffs can be extremely disruptive to families. Loss of energy services such as lighting, heating, cooling, food preservation, and well pumps had severe negative impacts on the finances, health, and safety of vulnerable families.

Members of SVDP provide assistance in our communities through our home visit program where we help families with unpaid rent and utilities. Recently, SVDP's home visit program received an assistance request from a young couple raising 3 children – ages 8, 5, and 2. The father works as a maintenance manager and the mother cares for the children in their home. After experiencing financial difficulties, the family was able to catch up on their rent, but still owed on their electric bill. Since the older child required a nebulizer breathing machine for asthma treatment, it was critical that the electric company did not shut off their power. SVDP helped pay the delinquent utility bill and prevented their electricity from being disconnected. SVDP also supplied the family with other resources to apply for additional assistance. Thank you for your generous gifts which allow us to make a real difference in the lives of the poor.
