SOCIETY OF ST. VINCENT DE PAUL NEWS Helping a Homeless Mother Living in a Car



St. Vincent de Paul dedicated his life to helping the poor. He founded a community of priests called Vincentians to help with his work with the poor. Today, St. Vincent's work continues at St. Timothy through our Society of St. Vincent de Paul conference (SVDP).

Not having enough money to pay expenses has become the norm for many families. A report by the National Low Income Housing Coalition found that Ohio fails to have an adequate supply of affordable rental housing. This has driven thousands to live in their vehicles. Contrary to popular belief, not all people who live in their vehicles are unemployed. Many simply work jobs that don't pay enough to afford adequate housing.

Recently, SVDP received a referral to assist a mother with an 11-year-old son. Even though the mother works at the Speedway/7-11, she had been living out of her car since September. Her concern was finding an apartment since cold weather was approaching. The mother recently filed for divorce and receives no support from the father. After finding an apartment which will allow her to walk to work, members of SVDP provided the mother with the financial help including the cost to move and the security deposit. She was very thankful for the financial assistance from SVDP. Going forward, the mother will make enough at her job to cover her monthly bills associated with the apartment.
