## PASTOR'S DESK

## From the Desk of Father Dan

I am providing again this week my comments on our efforts to get the parish financial situation better organized. Thank you to



those who responded this week to ask that their WeShare contributions be changed to Electronic Fund Transfers. I ask that you consider this transition if you currently use WeShare. With WeShare, the parish only gets a percentage of your donations. The rest is kept as a fee for the transaction.

One of the biggest challenges for me coming on board the first of August has been to straighten out the parish finances with the help of the new bookkeeper. We have had, and continue to have, staff from the Diocesan Finance Office to help us with this. They and the entire parish staff have been a blessing.

I can let you know of a couple of things that we have made progress on.

First of all, we are in the process of moving our accounts to Huntington Bank, which has welcomed our business and is willing to work with us. That has not been our experience with our current bank these past months.

Secondly, I think we have our electronic fund transfers working now; and for the majority of parishioners using EFT, there should be withdrawals starting December 1st. A couple of families will see a withdrawal this coming week (these contributions are designated for a special fund.) I realize that the EFT's have not been working since June or July. This, of course, has meant that we have not received the EFT contributions that you intended to donate to St. Tim's. If you would like to help make up this deficit (about \$11,000 per month), we would be happy to accept it!!

Thirdly, I want to remind you that from your contributions to St. Tim's through WeShare, we only receive 86 to 97 percent of the gifts you give because of the fees charged by WeShare. I would like to encourage you to consider using electronic fund transfers rather than WeShare. Huntington Bank does not charge for incoming EFTs. I would hope that eventually we could drop the WeShare program because, frankly, it's not fair to you that your total gift is not used for the purpose you intend.

If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the parish office. The process of totally moving our accounts to Huntington will, of course, take some time, but I feel confident that this is better stewardship of parish resources.


## SCHOOL NEWS

#### **CLOTHING FOR THE POOR**

Dorothy Day, Founder of the Catholic Worker Movement, stated that everything a baptized person does each day should be directly or indirectly related to the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. One of The Corporal Works of Mercy is to clothe the poor.

With your donations, The Society of St. Vincent de Paul (SVDP) is helping those in need by providing support and volunteers to the SVDP Clothing Distribution Center. The mission of the SVDP Clothing Distribution Center is to provide clean clothing and linens in good condition and without cost to the needy men, women and children.

The Clothing Distribution Center is located in the rear of the J.O.I.N. building at 578 E. Main Street in Downtown Columbus, and is open Monday through Thursday from 10:00 a.m. to Noon. Clients are escorted by SVDP volunteers as they select garments and linens on a quota system. Individuals and families are eligible to select the free clothing and linens every 30 days.

#### COATS FOR CHRISTMAS

The Annual Coats for Christmas giving will take place on the weekends of December 2nd, 9th and 16th. There will be a specially labeled box in the Church Lobby for your monetary donation. Your cash donation will go not only toward purchasing coats, but socks, gloves and other winter clothing items for the SVDP Clothing Distribution Center. If you decide to donate a coat or other clothing item, please deliver them next to the grocery cart in the church lobby.
