

PASTOR'S DESK Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The obligation to abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent is an important observance for us as Catholics. This year, Friday March 17 corresponds with St. Patrick's Day. Bishop Fernandes has granted a dispensation from the obligation of abstinence from meat on

St. Patrick's Day provided the person undertakes one of the following:

- 1. Makes a pilgrimage to one of our diocesan churches of St. Patrick (Columbus, London, Junction City).
- 2. Assists at Mass at any Church, Chapel, or Oratory.
- 3. Prays the "Breastplate of St. Patrick."
- 4. Prays the Rosary or Stations of the Cross or participates in Eucharistic Adoration on that day.

5. Abstains from meat on some other day earlier that week. I hope this helps you decide if you would like to eat some delicious corned beef on St. Patrick's Day. I've included the prayer of "St. Patrick's Breastplate" in this bulletin for your convenience. Have a good week!

LATEST NEWS FROM SAINT VINCENT **DE PAUL SOCIETY** Practical Ways to Do the Works of Mercy During Lent



During Lent, it is a time to show the love of God through our caring and loving actions toward others. The Society of St. Vincent de Paul (SVDP) gives us the opportunity to show the love of Christ through simple acts of kindness. Your donations during Lent allow SVDP to care for the poor through the following activities:

- Feeding the hungry with a sack lunch 5 days a week at St. Lawrence Haven.
- Providing food assistance for the poor at the St. James Pantry.
- Furnishing free clothing for the neediest of people at the SVDP Clothing Distribution Center.
- Giving financial assistance to individuals with unpaid rent and utilities.

In addition to your monetary donations to SVDP, there are other practical ways to carry out the works of mercy in your ordinary daily life. You can bring a food donation for the local pantry or gather up old clothes in your house and give them to charity. In the parish vestibule, each week we collect food for the St. James Pantry and clothing for the SVDP Clothing Distribution Center. Lastly, you can help make sandwiches for the St. Lawrence Haven on the Second Sunday of each month after the 9:00 a.m. Mass.

Throughout the Bible, God's people are reminded to care for those in need. Everyone needs food, clothing, and shelter. Even if we don't have much, we should use what we do have to help others. Whether it is providing a sandwich at St. Lawrence Haven or a warm winter coat at the SVDP Clothing Distribution Center, small things can make a difference.
