# SOCIETY OF SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL NEWS Helping Families with Food Insecurity

Pandemic food assistance that held back hunger recently ended in March. All 673,000 Ohio households received a sharp reduction in the size of their benefits under the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). On average, the SNAP benefits were cut by \$172.00 per household. More than 80% of SNAP beneficiaries are working families and individuals with disabilities or elderly people. The end of the extra benefits along with the rising costs of food has been a hardship for Ohio families.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul (SVDP) is helping families with food insecurity with the Food Pantry located at the St. James the Less Church at 1614 Oakland Park in North Linden. Volunteers from parishes throughout the diocese pack groceries each evening Monday through Friday. The SVDP Conference at St. Timothy contributes financial support and provides teams that volunteer at the St. James Pantry to supply groceries to over 700 needy clients each month.

The St. James Food Pantry is located in a Food desert or an urban area in which it is difficult to buy affordable or good quality fresh food. Many clients do not have the transportation to get to a grocery store which is miles away. The pantry provides healthy meals for the families in this impoverished neighborhood.

Each week, the SVDP conference at St. Timothy collects your nonperishable food items for the St. James Food Pantry in the grocery cart in the church vestibule. The St. James Food Pantry is currently in need of canned soup excluding tomato soup.

Thank you for your generous support which allows our SVDP conference at St. Timothy to conduct numerous programs to assist the poor in our local community.
