DEACON'S CORNER

"By His wounds we are healed"

The stories of Jesus' Easter appearances would be consistently positive and joyful. Yes, they are. But not everything is joyful. There is a shadow amid this joy which prompts us to ask, "What are the wounds doing there?" Why does the body of the Risen Lord still retain the wounds of His Passion?

This question seems to pose a problem. But it emerges as a gift. The wounds in the body of the Risen Christ, do not indicate that the Resurrection is incomplete. In fact, they show its power. The Risen Jesus re-defines what joy is.

Jesus has redefined joy. The wounds in the Risen body of Christ tell us that the way to be happy is not to forget our loss, not to deny our mistakes, not to ignore our pain. Instead, when these negative realities come to us, we are called to accept them and then to make them a part of a new body, a new body dedicated to life.

Like the wounds in Jesus' Risen body, the wounds in our life will not disappear. But they need not rob us of joy. They can become a part of a new kind of happiness. They can be signs of a wounded past whose memory does not mar the power of a resurrected life.

Let us join the whole universe in singing Alleluia because Our Lord has conquered death. He has conquered our past negative memories and has given us new life. Rejoice!
