PASTOR'S DESK

From the desk of Father Dan

In some sense, what I'm sharing with you this week is vague. But let me explain. I would like to gauge the interest of people in participating in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). This is the process by which

adults become members of the Catholic Church. It usually begins in the fall and concludes at Easter. Even though there are "no strings attached," participants are expected to attend the weekly sessions. What I mean is that you do not have to be committed to join the Church when you start attending the sessions, but you are committing to learning what the Church teaches and practices until you decide that Catholicism is not for you.

This process is a real commitment for the parishioners who organize and lead the weekly sessions. Therefore, we need to determine whether there is enough interest to go ahead and have the RCIA at St. Tim's this year. So far I've heard from two people who are interested in becoming Catholic. That is not enough to have the program in our parish. I think there should be a minimum of six participants.

If you know of someone who is thinking about becoming Catholic or who would like to know what the Church teaches and practices, please invite that person to call or email the Parish Office. We need to make a decision on whether to proceed or not by September 15th in order to begin the RCIA in October. Thank you.


Did You Know?

SOCIETY OF ST. VINCENT DE PAUL NEWS Helping a Family Facing Eviction

Many times, our community comes to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul (SVDP) when there is nowhere else to turn. Every one of your gifts to us makes an immediate and life-changing difference for each family that we feed or assist to prevent rent evictions and utility shutoffs.

Since August of 2020, our St. Timothy Conference has partnered with other SVDP organizations and has assisted 300 families with their past due rent and utilities through our home visit program. Most of these families were facing eviction after struggling to make their monthly rent and utility bills. One recent example was a family with three young children all under the age of 6 and expecting a new child being born next month. Both parents worked full-time until the mother had to cut back hours due to a pregnancy related illness. This caused the family to fall behind on their rent and eviction was filed. Stopping this eviction before it happened was critical. Evictions are a destabilizing event that can send a family into a cycle of financial and emotional turmoil. SVDP provided the rent assistance to stop eviction proceedings and supplied the family with other resources to apply for additional assistance.

God's own goodness touches the world through our charitable acts. Thanks to all our SVDP contributors for making a real difference in the lives of the poor.
