Grandparents/Special Friends Day



Rehousing a Homeless Family

St. Vincent de Paul dedicated his life to helping the poor. He founded a community of priests called Vincentians to help with his work with the poor. Today, St. Vincent's work continues at St. Timothy through our Society of St. Vincent de Paul conference (SVDP).

The Wall Street Journal just released an estimate of the number of homeless people in the U.S. finding that nearly 577,000 experienced homelessness on a single night. The single biggest factor contributing to the rise in the number of homeless was the high cost of housing. Ben Carson, the former United States Secretary of Housing and Urban Development, stated that both government agencies and charities are needed to stop evictions and rehouse the homeless.

We recently had an example of the local government working with nonprofits such as SVDP to rehouse a homeless family in our Diocese. The family had four young children including a baby born on July 5. The family had struggled with homelessness for a number of months. The Metropolitan Housing Authority found affordable rental housing and provided a low-income housing apartment on the south side of town. Before the electricity could by connected, the family needed to settle an outstanding electric bill. The family also needed some furniture for the apartment. Our SVDP partnered with other conferences to resolve the prior electric bill and obtain financial assistance for furniture, food, and diapers for the newborn. The young homeless family was very grateful for our financial help which allowed them to move out of the shelter and into their own apartment. Thank you for your generous support which allows our SVDP conference at St. Timothy to conduct numerous programs to assist the poor in our Columbus Diocese.
