

DIOCESAN LEADERSHIP TEAMS GATHER FOR SECOND MEETING


On January 11, 2024, leadership teams from the Dioceses of Columbus and Steubenville met for the second time to discuss how both Dioceses could be affected by a potential merger.

Previously, the Apostolic Nunciature asked the bishops and their leadership teams to work together to consider how different dimensions of the Dioceses might be affected by such a proposal.

The second meeting focused on financial implications, personnel matters, and structures. This information has provided clarification equipping Diocesan leadership to present a thorough report to Archbishop Dennis Schnurr in March 2024.

It is important to remember that no decision regarding a merger has been made. The final decision will be made by the Holy Father, Pope Francis. This process of discernment is distinct from the process of implementation should a merger occur.

Bishop Paul J. Bradley, Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese of Steubenville, and Bishop Earl K. Fernandes of the Diocese of Columbus continue to ask for the prayers of the clergy and laity.

HELPING FAMILIES STRUGGLING WITH FOOD INFLATION

Food inflation is hurting the average American family. According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, food prices increased by 9.9 percent in 2022 and 7.9 percent in 2023. These recent increases in food prices are causing great concern for the poor. Inflation increases the cost of food and worsens food scarcity, increasing the likelihood that families will remain trapped in a cycle of poverty. If a family is unable to afford food due to inflation, children experience hunger, undernourishment and even malnutrition.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul (SVDP) is helping address this problem of food inflation with the St. Lawrence Haven operation located at 244 E. Rich Street in downtown Columbus. Volunteers from parishes throughout the Diocese make sandwiches and hot meals which feed 200 people each day. The food is distributed Monday through Friday afternoon at Holy Cross Church. St. Lawrence Haven was able to provide 50,000 meals and distribute more than 400,000 pounds of food to our hungry neighbors in 2023.

Members of St. Timothy Church make sandwiches for St. Lawrence Haven on the second Sunday of each month after the 9:00 a.m. Mass in the school cafeteria. Last year, St. Timothy Church delivered over 6,000 sandwiches to the St. Lawrence Haven operation. Thank you to all of our Parish members who assist each month with our sandwich making to help feed our neighbors in need.

Due to the increased demand, St. Lawrence Haven is currently struggling to keep food supplies on their shelves and needs our help. The items in short supply include granola bars and individually wrapped cookies, crackers and chips. In addition, the SVDP Free Clothing Distribution Center is in need of men's winter coats for the poor. If you would like to donate, please deliver them next to the grocery cart in the church lobby.

Throughout the Bible, God's people are reminded to care for those in need. Everyone needs food, shelter and water. Even if we don't have much, we should use what we do have to help others. Whether it is providing a sandwich at St. Lawrence Haven or a warm winter coat at the SVDP Clothing Distribution Center, small things can make a difference.




