to feel my independence from my parents. Starting high school, first job, driver's license - all were small steps that led eventually to the necessary separation between child and parent.





A major message of the New Testament and Jesus Christ is that humanity should do all that it can to help the poor. The Society of St. Vincent de Paul (SVDP) has been putting these words into practice for 170 years. Your financial contributions each month support the following activities:

- Feeding the hungry with a sack lunch 5 days a week at St. Lawrence Haven which serves over 200 clients each day.
